Assembly / commissioning


Important: The battery is not activated at delivery. For commissioning, remove the insulating strip (A)

Make sure the radio link is unobstructed. Avoid installing the unit in a distributor box or metal housing, in direct proximity to large metal objects, or on or close to the floor. Check the installation surface for hidden cables, etc.

Installation:


- 1. Attach the fixing plate to the installation location using the screws and wall plugs.
- 2. For programming the wall transmitter to the radio control or receiver: see "Programming the transmitter / channel".
- 3. Insert the wall transmitter and the Silent Gliss frame into the fixing plate at a right angle with the wall.

Asynchronous programming mode

Programming the transmitter / channel for multiple receivers

Requirement: The receiver is installed Programming can only be performed in one selected channel. Several receivers can be programmed to one channel.

- 1. Switch the circuit off and on again: The receiver will remain ready to program / in programming mode for approx. 5 minutes.
- 2. Position yourself with the transmitter to be programmed within sight and radio range of the blind.
- 3. Press the [P] programming button for approx. 1 second.
 - The blind will move up and down for approximately 2 minutes (programming mode). If several receivers are connected to the same feed line, then all are simultaneously ready to program / in programming mode. The blinds will start moving up and down randomly. The longer programming is delayed, the greater the offset will be. Individual receivers can now be assigned to the respective channel of the transmitter.
- 4. Immediately (maximum 1 second) after the start of upward travel, press the [UP ▲] button. The blind will stop for a short time.
- 5. Immediately (maximum 1 second) after the start of downward travel, press the [DOWN/CLOSE ▼] button. The blind will stop. Important: You can stop receivers that you do not want to program by pressing the STOP button ■ on an already programmed transmitter. You can now make the channel assignment/ change without having to disconnect the individual receivers
- 6. If the blind moves in the opposite direction or the blind does not stop after programming, delete the transmitter from the receiver and repeat the programming process.
- 7. SG 11490 is now programmed.

Stopping programming mode in the transmitter Press the [STOP ■] button for at least 6 seconds until the LED status flashes orange.

Programming additional transmitters / channels to one receiver

- 1. Press the [UP ▲]+[DOWN/CLOSE ▼]+[P] buttons simultaneously for 3 seconds on a transmitter that has already been programmed to the receiver. The LED status and operating mode ④ goes out after about 3 seconds. The receiver will remain in programming mode for approximately 5 minutes. Press the programming button [P] on the transmitter to be programmed for approximately 1 second.
- 2. Immediately (maximum 1 second) after the start of upward travel, press the [UP ▲] button. The LED status and operating mode @ lights up briefly. The blind stops, starts moving again. stops again, and then moves downwards.
- Immediately (maximum 1 second) after the start of downward travel, press the [DOWN/CLOSE ▼] button. The indicator light will light up briefly. The blind will stop.
- 4. The transmitter or the transmitter channel has been programmed.

Deleting individual transmitters / channels

- 1. Press the [STOP ■]+[P] buttons simultaneously and hold them down for approx. 6 seconds.
- 2. The indicator light will light up orange and

Delete all transmitters and receivers

To perform a factory reset, all selected drives must be supplied with power.

- 1. Press the [UP ▲]+[DOWN/CLOSE ▼]+ [STOP ■]+[P] buttons and hold them down for at least 6 seconds.
- 2. LED status 4 shines orange first and then red.

Selection button 9

Auto	Manual
A receiver that is programmed responds to the timer function of a corresponding control unit or to commands by sensors.	A receiver that is programmed does not respond to the timer function of a corresponding control unit or to commands by sensors.

- Short operation: Display of the current operating mode Auto / Manual with selection Next channel / Central channel.
- Operation approx. 1 s duration: Display of the current operating mode Auto / Manual without channel change.
- Long press approx. 2 s duration: Switch between operating modes Auto and Manual.

Important:

Wind sensors trigger corresponding travel movements in both operating modes.

Configuring the drive

Defining the intermediate position Requirement:

The blind is in the upper end position.

- 1. Press the [**DOWN/CLOSE** ▼] button until
- the desired intermediate position is reached.

 2. Additionally, briefly press the [STOP ■] button.

 The blind will stop. The intermediate position has now been stored.

Define one of the ventilation/tilting/fabric tautening positions

Requirement:

The blind is in the lower end position.

- Press the [UP ▲] button until the ventilation gaps open, the venetian blind slats are tilted or the awning fabric is taut.
- Additionally, briefly press the [STOP ■] button. The blind will stop. The ventilation / tilting / fabric tautening position has been stored.

Moving to the intermediate position Requirement:

The intermediate position is defined and the blind is in the upper end position (combined with Combio).

 Press the [DOWN/CLOSE ▼] button twice (in quick succession): The blind moves to the saved intermediate position.

If no intermediate position has been defined, the blind moves to the lower end position. **Important**: If you are using venetian blinds and a defined tilt position, the venetian blind slats will also tilt.

If no tilt position has been defined, the blind will stop at the intermediate position with the slats closed.

Moving to the ventilation / tilting / fabric tautening positions

Requirement:

The position of the ventilation / tilting / fabric tautening is defined and the blind is in the lower end position (combined with Combio).

 Press the [OPEN ▲] button twice in quick succession:

The blind moves to the saved position. If no ventilation / tilting / fabric tautening position is defined, the blind moves to the upper end position.

Deleting the intermediate position

Requirement: The transmitter is programmed.

1. Press the [DOWN/CLOSE ▼]+ [STOP ■]
buttons simultaneously for approx. 3 seconds.
The intermediate position is now deleted.

The indicator light will light up briefly. Deleting the ventilation position / tilting position / fabric tautening position

Requirement: The transmitter is programmed.

1. Press the [UP ▲]+ [STOP ■] button simultaneously for approx. 3 seconds.

The ventilation / tilting / fabric tautening position has now been deleted. The LED status and operating mode ④ lights up briefly.

Replacing the battery

After a battery change, the transmitter programming is retained; QuinTec does to have to be reprogrammed into the radio receiver/transmitter

- Pry the wall transmitter module ③ and the Silent Gliss frame ② out of the fixing plate ①.
- Carefully pull the battery out of the battery compartment ® using a blunt, insulated tool. Use only a CR 2032 battery. Make sure the polarity is correct. The positive terminal must be visible.
- 3. Reinsert the wall transmitter ③ into the fixing plate ①.

Dispose of the used battery in accordance with environmental regulations.

Central channel

- Same control system for several receivers with one travel command.
- All programmed receivers can be controlled in the central channel.
- SG 11490 can be programmed in several receivers.

Synchronous programming mode

For programming one transmitter to multiple receivers at the same time.

- Press the [DOWN/CLOSE ▼]+ [P] buttons simultaneously for 3 seconds on a transmitter that has already been programmed to the receiver. The status LED flashes orange and green multiple times. The receivers are now synchronously in programming mode. The blind moves in briefly in the down direction.
- With the transmitter to be programmed, perform steps 1 to 7 as described under "Programming the transmitter / channel".
